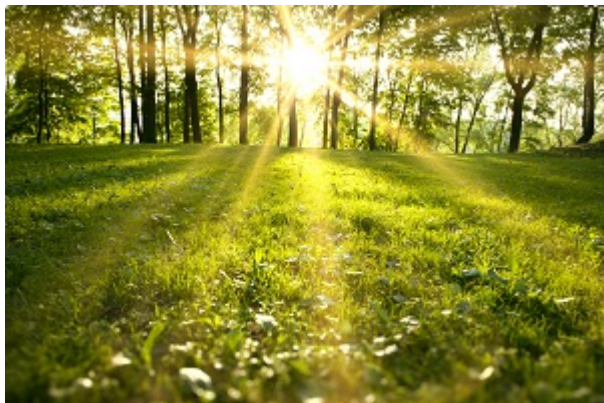


Students & Early Careers
